# **Examinations February 2024**

- The three exams are compulsory for all Master's students.
- All Master's students will be registered for the compulsory exams **automatically**.
- The form "Application for Admission to Exams" must be submitted by all Master's students to Mrs Böhler (pruefungsverwaltung.wiwi@uni-konstanz.de) by 7th December 2023
- If you wish to defer taking one of the compulsory first year modules and its exams until the third semester, you need to fill out a form "Application to defer a first year compulsory module" and submit it to Mrs Böhler (pruefungsverwaltung.wiwi@uni-Konstanz.de) by 10th January 2024.
- To take study track A (Fast Track to a PhD) you need to pass all three compulsory courses on the first semester and obtain an average of 2.0 or better.

# **Examinations February 2024**

- Registration period: 16.01.–23.01.2024
- Registered candidates who do not attend an exam without a recognized reason (i.e. illness) receive the grade 5.0 (fail).
- If a candidate cannot attend an examination due to illness, he or she must inform Mrs Böhler before the exam begins and forward a medical certificate form immediately (i.e. on the day of the exam) to Mrs Böhler (room F 258, tel. 07531-88 2314, e-mail: pruefungsverwaltung.wiwi@uni-konstanz.de)

- Master's students who do not pass a February exam will be automatically registered for the resit exam in March/April. A second resit exam (upon request) is only possible for two exams.

# Academic adjustments for coursework and performance assessments

Students with disabilities and chronic illnesses can be at a serious disadvantage during their studies. To offset some of the additional difficulties and impediments students face, we provide academic adjustments.

These academic adjustments need to be officially requested and granted by the examination board.

# **Grading System**

1.0 1.3	very good	an excellent performance
1.7 2.0 2.3	good	a performance significantly above average
2.7 3.0 3.3	satisfactory	a performance which corresponds to average requirements
3.7 4.0	sufficient	a performance which, despite shortcomings, still meets the requirements
5.0	insufficient	a performance with considerable shortcomings, which no longer meets the requirements

### New exam regulations (PO 2024)

#### What are the main changes for you in the PO 2024 compared to the PO 2011?

- No more Track A
- No more automatic exam registration for the compulsory courses in the area Quantitative Economics
- Instead new regulation: until the end of the second semester you need to have gained at least 30 ECTS and you have to have passed at least two of the compulsory courses in the area Quantitative Economics
- No more automatic exam registration for exams of elective courses (if you failed an exam or could no attend due to illness), instead you can choose an alternative elective course
- No more requests for a third try in an exam in the elective area instead you can/have to choose another elective course
- Double Degree students from Tor Vergata will have to transfer to the new exam regulations

### When do I have to decide?

### **Examination regulations**

You will have to decide according to which examination regulations you wish to study until 15.12.23.

You wish to study according to the new regulations (PO2024) -> you do not have to do anything, the transfer will be automatic

You wish to remain in the old examination regulations (PO2011) -> you have to hand in the form "Request to remain in the examination regulations 2011" until 15.12.23 to Mrs Böhler (<u>pruefungsverwaltung.wiwi@uni-konstanz.de</u>). You will find the form from 2.11.23 onwards here on our website.

### **Study Track**

Study Track A -> hand in request to remain in old exam regulations until 15.12.23, out in a request to be placed in study track A after you received the grades of all three first semester courses by writing an E-Mail to Hanna Schwarz (<u>coordination.econ@uni-konstanz.de</u>)

**Study Track B or C** -> official request to be placed in the track with the registration for the Master thesis; you are choosing your track by choosing your courses to fulfill the requirements

### **Course registration**

#### - Important: Registration necessary for all courses

- At the Department of Economics you are allowed to take part in onsite and/or online courses only if you have registered for them via <u>ZEuS</u>. Please, note the following:
- The registration for the courses is absolutely necessary as you will then be automatically added to the respective course folders on <u>ILIAS</u>. The lecturers usually provide their teaching material there.
- As soon as you have been automatically added to the relevant ILIAS courses, you will receive a system-generated e-mail from ILIAS confirming that you have joined the course. However, it is possible that the link contained in the mail leads you to a course that is still "offline" and therefore not yet visible to you. In this case, you can rest assured: the lecturers will all put the courses "online" in the next few weeks.

### **Course registration**

### - Important: Registration necessary for all courses

- Please note that you cannot join an ILIAS course on your own. You first need to register via ZEuS. As soon as you have completed the course registration on ZEuS, you will automatically be added to the corresponding ILIAS course!




